As you prepare for worship... Advent 1C

Note: Advent prepares us for the return of the Lord in Glory to complete the plan of salvation...

Jeremiah 33:14-16: In the midst of devastation (the destruction of Jerusalem, the Temple and the captivity in Babylon) God assures his people that he has not abandoned them. In fact God promises them health and prosperity, with the cities full of people and animals again. In our reading today God promises somebody will be raised up from David's line who will rule justly and with God's righteousness, bringing salvation. We, of course, know this "somebody" to be Jesus!

1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2: As Paul predicted, persecution has come to the Church. Paul promises to pray for them and reassures them that when Christ returns all our faithful dead will rise to eternal life with him.

Luke 21:25-28, 34-36: Jesus is speaking to his disciples about the end times and his return in glory. His return will be cosmic in nature, impacting the sun, moon, stars and cause distress all over the earth. Then he says something reassuring: unlike other people, we will not be afraid. In-stead, we will stand up and lift our heads (rather than cower in fear) because we will know it is the Lord! So we "keep watch" and are alert for this tremendous event.
