What is Candlemas?

"My eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation"

The ancient church skillfully embraced established pagan festivals, transforming them into beautiful new Christian celebrations while also syncing those events with the natural world's rhythms and seasons. This is why the "Christmas season"—already wrapped up in the secular calendar—continues to shine within the church until February 2nd. On this special day, known as Candlemas, we celebrate the Christian Festival of Lights, marking the gentle conclusion of Christmas. Forty days after the joyous birth of Jesus, we reflect on His presentation in the temple, where Simeon and Anna joyfully recognized the light of God shining through this precious baby boy.

Candlemas falls at the heart of winter and holds practical significance, too—during the 'Candle-Mass', we bless the candles used in both churches and homes, preparing them for the coming year. It's interesting to note that the secular world has borrowed from the early church, reinterpreting February 2nd as Groundhog Day, stepping away from its rich Christian heritage.

Although we no longer rely on candles to light our homes and churches, Candlemas nonetheless invites a simple and meaningful expression of faith in our modern world.

The Sermon Synopsis

Today's sermon emphasizes Jesus' presentation in the temple as a pivotal revelation. Simeon and Anna recognize Him as the Messiah, proclaiming Him as a light for all nations and a source of salvation. Their faith encourages us to embrace Christ's light, transforming our hearts and guiding our actions. This story invites us to live openly, share God's grace, and spread Christ's light in the world.

Gospel LUKE 2:22-40

The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Saint Luke Glory to You Lord Jesus Christ

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord"), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too."

There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy bread of eternal life and the cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded:

We praise thee, we bless thee, we thank thee, and we pray to thee, Lord our God.

And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion; And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. **AMEN.**
